- 10 questions must be answered out of a possible 16 questions
- Each question is worth 50 marks
- 3 hours
- 55% Pass Mark
- Those who have passed the PRINCE2® Practitioner exam can take a special shorter examination. In this, there are 10 questions of which 6 must be answered.
